TOP TIPS USING LINE MAKER

TOP TIPS:

- Use different widths to create different weight lines, thinner lines for finer details and thicker lines for bolder details.
- 2 Create different lines for a variety of styles, sketchy lines for a looser style, broken lines for a freer style.
- 3 Try crosshatching to shade large areas, the closer together your lines the darker the area, the further apart your lines are the lighter your shading.
- 4 Create a wider range of colours by creating the illusion of secondary colours by cross hatching red with yellow to create the illusion of orange, green with yellow to create a yellow green.
- 5 Great not only for art and illustration but also journaling.
- 6 Use black Line Makers for dark areas and the areas in your art that you want to push the depth even more such as Watercolour or Inktense and add the shadows or the glint in an eye.
- 7 Combine sepia and black or grey and black for monochrome effects.
- 8 Use Line Makers before colour pencil, colour pencil is oil or wax based which can be hard to adhere to.
- 9 Combine Line Makers with inktense.
- Try urban sketching, for a modern contemporary look use the coloured Line Makers.
- For cityscapes combine Line Makers with Graphitint, use shades of black, grey and sepia with the muted tones of the Graphitint range for a modern cityscape using the Line Makers to home in on the architectural details.

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
