"We acknowledge that many of our team members have been volunteering their time to assist the communities impacted by the bushfires and we want to ensure we can support them in their efforts," he said.

"We're pleased to be making paid leave available for our team members when volunteering for a recognised emergency management body such as the CFA, RFS and SES. We feel this goes some way in acknowledging the valuable role our team play in these communities.

We join others in saying a huge thank you to everyone involved for their efforts to support these communities in need so far, and with the challenges ahead," he said.
