A Garland of Gingerbread Men



WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- Kadink Construction Paper A4 Assorted 500 Pack
- Quill A4 240gsm Kraft Board 25 Pack
- Uni Liquid Chalk Marker Bullet Tip White
- J.Burrows Double-sided Tape with Dispenser 12mm x 25m
- Studymate Soft Grip Scissors 6"/152mm
- Keji 1 Hole Plier Punch
- Keji Glue 35g 2 Pack (not pictured)

→ Like the paper dolls you made as a kid, only the Christmas version! This activity is an excellent chance for kids to work on their scissor skills: little hands may want to use kraft paper which is easier to cut (and gingerbread-colour!) or for a more hardy garland, coloured board will hang well in their room or over a mantelpiece.



STEP 1Fold your kraft board into strips. Cut down the folds, creating long panels.



STEP 2Fold a panel, concertina style backwards and forwards so when you open it up there are three squares.



STEP 3

Trace your gingerbread shape onto the top fold. Cut out the shape, but leave the hands touching the edges.



STEP 4

Open to reveal three men! Add face with a marker, and glue on buttons made by a hole punch on red card.



STEP 5

Repeat for another panel and tape the panels together. Keep repeating to make the garland as long as you like.



A Paper Christmas Tree Farm



WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- Kadink Adhesive Crystals Rainbow 247 Pack
- Quik Stickers Self-adhesive Labels Gold Stars
- Kadink Construction Paper A4 Assorted 500 Pack
- ☐ Kadink Pom Poms Assorted 70 Pack
- Studymate Kids PVA Glue 250mL
- J.Burrows Double-sided Tape with Dispenser 12mm x 25m
- Studymate Soft Grip Scissors 6"/152mm

→ A classic and easy craft for kids of all ages, a paper cone can easily transform into a Christmas tree, and several into a Christmas tree farm! Let their imaginations run wild with the decorations, using sticky gems or pom poms as baubles.



STEP 1

Trace a paper cone template onto a piece of A4 paper. It's like a wide triangle with a curved bottom.



STEP 2

Cut out the template ready to build. Tip: For multiple trees, layer paper and cut them out in one go!



STEP 3

Twist the shape into a cone and secure at the back using double-sided tape.



STEP 4

Add 'baubles' using sticky gems, pom poms or cut up pieces of paper.



STEP 5

Finish with a star at the top using gold star stickers, or even add a few together to make a special, bigger star.



Santa Belt Napkin Rings



WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- Keji Glue 35g 2 Pack
- Studymate Soft Grip Scissors 6"/152mm
- Kadink Construction Paper A4 Assorted 500 Pack

→ If your Christmas lunch table needs a sprinkle of festive cheer, get the kids to make some napkin rings! All you need for these "Santa buckle" designs is paper, coloured board, scissors and a glue stick, making it mess-free but loads of fun. Bonus point is it works their dexterity too!



STEP 1

Fold an A4 piece of red paper in half, and then in half again, so when you open it up you can see four strips.



STEP 2

Cut along the folds, creating strips for the base of your napkin ring.



STEP 3

Fold a black piece of A4 paper the same way, only into thinner strips, for the middle of Santa's belt.



STEP 4

Cut a small yellow square, then fold in half to cut a smaller square inside it, so it opens to a belt buckle shape.



STEP 5

Glue the black on top of the red, and the yellow buckle on top of the black in the centre. Glue ends to make a ring.
